

### SARAH ROUSH AN ICON OF PADUCAH'S CREATIVE COMMUNITY.

Sarah Roush was a vanguard in Paducah. She and her husband Dr. Jim Roush, invested in a building on Market House Square at a time when Market House Square wasn't considered a very good neighborhood. Sarah fixed up the building and operated an art gallery in that space, 2 Street Gallery. She had shows of great artists from across the region. Sarah believed that an artist should exhibit publicly – new work. She would get restless if she went too long without an exhibition of some sort.

Sarah's handmade tiles grace two important buildings downtown, one on Market House Square and one at 409 Broadway. Those mosaics have become a unique and important part of the downtown heritage. Sarah was a painter, printmaker, and ceramist who studied at University of Cincinnati. Not only did she have a large body of her own work, but she was an avid art collector.

Sarah was the main force behind the Paducah Wastelanders artist group. She conceived of the group, helped organize it, and provided exhibition space free of charge. The group first exhibited in 2007, in Sarah's space. From then until her death in 2010, and even afterward, the group continued to exhibit in spaces that Sarah provided for free to the group. The Wastelanders continue to exhibit currently.

Sarah battled cancer for over a decade. She accomplished so much in that time. She was a warrior in so many ways. Paducah benefits from her time here.
